Emad Armoush is an accomplished professional musician living in Vancouver, Canada and pursuing a very active career as an Arabic and Flamenco singer, Oud and Ney player, and Flamenco guitarist since 2000.

Originally from Syria, Emad had moved away from home since his youth, and has lived for extended periods of time in many countries in the Middle East, Europe, and North America, and is fluent in Arabic, Spanish and English. In his teens, he developed the passion for learning traditional Arabic percussion and soon after the singing, but his journey from Syria to Vancouver has brought him into contact with many inspiring Arabic, Flamenco, Turkish and Jazz musicians and teachers, thus expanding his endeavors over the years to learning multiple instruments and performing in these genres.

In 2002, Emad formed his own groups "Aire Flamenco Arabic Music" and "Rayhan". He performs with them regularly at venues and music festivals. He has collaborated with many local and international groups such as "Flamenco Flow" and Flamenco de la Mission" from Europe, the "Lache Cercel's Roma Swing Ensemble" and the "Orchid Ensemble" from Vancouver.

In 2009, Emad joined Gordon Grdina 10-piece Arabic – Avant-Garde Ensemble "HARAM" as a vocalist and Ney player. The band consists of some of Canada's best Jazz and World musicians.
